## **STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES**

The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse by an exhibitor, trainer or other person at an AEF Wild Rose sanctioned competition shall not be tolerated under any circumstances. The competition organizing committee has the right to bar such violators from further participation in the competition, if necessary.

## **What is the Wild Rose Competition Program?**

The Alberta Equestrian Federation (AEF) is pleased to offer the Wild Rose Competition program, a provincial level competition to help support and grow riders and horses. The goal of the program is to provide an affordable competition sanctioning program to support and help develop the grassroots level of competition. The program serves as a stepping stone for athletes to step into the national competition program, thereby supporting the development of competitors in Alberta.

## **GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION**

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)
2. The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules, and to correct any error or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list. EC rules and regulations will be followed.
3. The management reserves the right to cancel or combine any class not filled to satisfaction, where upon exhibitors will be notified as soon as possible after close of entries.
4. Management reserves the right to change the class order, if necessary, after the close of entries. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to determine when their classes will be judged.
5. Inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. Violation of this rule, at the discretion of the organization committee, will result in disqualification and forfeiture of fees.
6. Any exhibitor using a wrong number, or having no number, may be excused, or disqualified from the class, at the judge's discretion.

7. Exhibitors are responsible for reporting all entries to the paddock master before each respective class is called. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to determine when their class will be judged. A gate hold will prevail as a courtesy only.
8. Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, handler or rider, or any other person associated with a given entry will disqualify the horse, and result in forfeiture of entry fees for subsequent classes. Management reserves the right to remove a groom, handler/ rider and/ or horse from the show, without being liable for compensation.
9. No judge shall be approached regarding any decision during the time he is judging or is about to judge. Penalty will be disqualification from the show in its entirety.
10. The medical aid fee covers the cost of the medical aid on site. The fee does not cover personal expenses incurred by the injured party in the event of an injury or transportation by ambulance.
11. No person other than officials, staff on duty, and the judges of the classes may enter the competition rings without permission of the tournament management. Competitors are allowed in the competition rings only when competing, when the course is open for walking or during scheduled schooling rounds.
12. **Dogs must always be on a leash. No dogs will be permitted in the main Arena building.**
13. **Proper attire is always required in the show rings. Tucked in collared shirts may be worn in the show ring. Jackets are encouraged for Classic competitions. Half chaps with paddock boots and rubber boots are permitted but should be cleaned and presented in a manner that is respectful to the sport.**
14. Lunging will be permitted in the warm-up ring during posted times, and for the first 20 minutes of scheduled Open Arena Hacking breaks.
15. Smoking or vaping is not allowed within 6 meters of any barn or building.

#### **ARTICLE G102 HEADGEAR**

At all EC-sanctioned competitions, anyone mounted on a horse, including foreign competitors, must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.

#### **VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS**

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition 2024 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A Page 25 Management. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

#### **ARTICLE A602.7**

Per Article A801, every entry at an AEF or EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition."

## RV PARKING

1. Campers or motorhomes are to be booked on entry form for \$45 per night, or \$150 per week. Please confirm request. Days are charged like a hotel, Check-in – flexible, Check-out – by 11:00AM.

## STABLING & HAUL-INS

1. Stabling will be available for the show on a first come first serve basis for \$230 + GST for all stalls, including tack and feed rooms. This includes 2 bags of shavings. Additional bags may be purchased in the show office. Type of stall needed must be indicated on entry form (or Haul-In).
2. 2-Day Stalls are available for booking at \$125.00. \*This includes a Single Night Stay only.\*
3. Stalls are 10X10 and not matted, unmatted stalls are required to be pre-bedded with a minimum of 5 bales of shavings.
4. Shavings are available for sale from the show office. Price is subject to change, based on supply conditions, prior to each event. Please check entry form for prices, for each event. Hay is not available for purchase at the Show Office (but can be found just 3km away at Heartland Feeds).
5. Shavings orders will only be accepted via entry forms, or with shavings order forms, which will be available in the show office.
6. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management.
7. Overnight Horses must be tended to by 7AM the next morning.
8. Stabling will be available from 10:00 am on the Wednesday of each week and must be vacated at the end of the competition on Sunday \$40 charge to stay Sunday night.
9. Stalls must be cleaned daily, and manure deposited in the areas provided. Please do not mix other garbage with manure. Stalls **do not** need to be stripped at the conclusion of the event.
10. Stalls are not pre-matted.
11. Haul-ins are welcome at a cost of \$45 per day, or \$150 per week. Availability of a day stall is not guaranteed, please request use of a day stall at the show office upon arrival. Day stalls are \$75 per day.
12. Stalls may be bedded with shavings ONLY.
13. Please Tidy after yourselves while hand-walking down isles. Leave stabling area clear of garbage on Departure. **\$150 Clean-Up Fees will apply for those who fail to comply.**
14. Stall plaques may not be changed without management's permission. Doing so will result in a \$50 charge.

## SCHOOLING

1. Arena will be open for hacking, but not jumping at times indicated on the Weekly and Daily Schedules.
2. The Warm-up Ring is intended to have only horses within the Top 10 Count active in the arena.
3. **Lunging is permitted in the schooling ring during the morning hack period each morning, and during the open hacking period in the afternoon. There will be no lunging in the competition ring or during competitions at any time.**

## ENTRIES

1. Credit Card Numbers are required on all entry Forms. If deposits are sent by E-transfer, CC # is still required.
2. A deposit payment of \$250 must accompany all entries. Payment may be made by E-transfer, cheque, money order, credit card or cash. Entries without deposit will be considered late. In case of event being sold out, entries without deposit will not have a spot held.

3. All competitors will be required to include credit card information on entry forms, for deposit and to cover any additional expenses incurred during the horse show. Accounts may be settled via E-transfer or Credit Card. **Credit Card transactions will incur a 3.5% processing fee. This fee is not applicable with Deposit payments.**
4. Entry forms MUST be signed. A parent/legal guardian must sign for juniors. A trainer's signature is not valid. Please list your coach's name on the entry form, if you ride with one, to facilitate the draws for class order and stabling.
5. If desiring to be stabled with another barn or trainer, please list on entry form.
6. Hors Concours rounds will be permitted under the rules of Equestrian Canada.
7. Numbers must always be worn and visible while on the competition grounds.
8. **All Competitors must hold an Alberta Equestrian Federation Membership. Or Equivalent PTSO membership**
9. Entries for the Ponoka Indoor Series must use the 2026 Ponoka Indoor Series-entry form.
10. Additional Riders of one horse, must fill out the rider portion of an entry form and sign the waiver. Splits between participants must be determined ahead of check-out.
11. Entries for each show must be received by:

**Season Setup: March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2026**

**Winter Welcome: November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026**

12. **Incomplete entries will be considered late. In case of event being sold out, Incomplete entries will not have a spot held.**
13. Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms.
14. Entries received after the closing date will be subject to a \$50 late fee.
15. The management reserves the right to limit entries in any division and to refuse or decline any entry without being liable for compensation or damages.
16. Non-competing horses are subject to the Administration/Medic fee as well as a \$20 per day schooling fee.
17. The Ponoka Indoor Series are Jump Alberta sanctioned events. **Membership is optional, however, only members are eligible for Jump Alberta year end awards.** Contact us for details.
18. Failure to close out an account at the close of the horse show will result in a \$50.00 processing fee.

**ADD/SCRATCHES**

1. Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date but prior to Wednesday of the Show week, upon presentation of a valid veterinarian certificate, will not be charged. Veterinary Scratches after Wednesday of the show week will forfeit their \$250.00 deposit.
2. Non-veterinarian scratches, after the entry closing date, will not be refunded their \$250.00 deposit.
3. Horse substitutions will be permitted, prior to Wednesday of the show week, for a fee of \$50.00.
4. Class adds, and scratches made prior to the show office closing the day prior - will incur no penalty. Adds or scratches after closing, or the day of will be assessed a \$10.00 add fee per class; in case of a sellout, where same day adds are closed, scratches will not be refunded. Entries that fail to scratch before the end of the competition, will not be refunded. Entries may change classes for a \$10.00 charge.
5. Management reserves the right to refuse adds after the closing, or the day of. Deposits will not be refunded to entries who fail to start by the closing on the previous night.

**PRIZES & CHAMPIONSHIPS**

1. Ribbons will be given to sixth place in all classes unless otherwise specified.
2. Prize money will be divided as follows unless otherwise specified:  

First=25%, Second=20%, Third=15%, Fourth=12%,  
 Fifth=10%, Sixth=8%, Seventh=5%, Eighth=5%
3. Classic competitions require a minimum of 5 entries for prize money to be paid.
4. Points for championships shall be awarded on the following basis:

**PLACING POINTS**

<b>1st</b>	<b>7</b>	<b>4th</b>	<b>3</b>
<b>2nd</b>	<b>5</b>	<b>5th</b>	<b>2</b>
<b>3rd</b>	<b>4</b>	<b>6th</b>	<b>1</b>

1. The Champion and Reserve titles shall be awarded to the two horses that have accumulated the most points performing over the courses in the division in which they are being shown. In the case of a tie the Championship and/or Reserve title shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points in the final competition of the division. Further ties will be decided by the penultimate competition in the division.
2. A minimum of 3 entries in a division are necessary for division championship prizes to be awarded.

**ENTRY NUMBERS & DRUG FEES**

1. Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times, while mounted or hand walking
2. Competitors are responsible for providing their own numbers. Bridle numbers may be purchased in the show office for \$10.00
3. Drug fees and testing are covered by the AEF Levy, for Wild Rose Provincial sanctioned competitions.

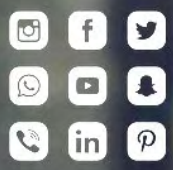

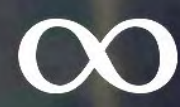

**THIS TEAM RELAY COMPETITIONS RUNS AS FOLLOWS:** Team of Two Riders Enter Ring Together. The first Athlete starts the timer jumps their round and having taken the last obstacle; the next Athlete starts their round, Crossing the Finish line to stop the timer. As soon as the horses’ forefeet of his team member jumping the last obstacle have reached the ground, the next Athlete may jump his first obstacle. This Competitions is run under Table C.

(FEI ARTICLE 227 Other Team Competitions) **1.1 General Rules:** This competition is for teams of two Athletes. The team members enter the arena together **1.2.** The course shown on the plan must be completed consecutively according to the number of team members. **1.3.** The First Teammate going through the starting line must jump the first obstacle and the Athlete jumping the last obstacle must also cross the finishing line in order to stop the clock. If an Athlete crosses the finishing line after another Athlete has jumped the penultimate obstacle, the team is eliminated. **1.4.** The time of the round is taken from the moment when the first Athlete crosses the starting line until the last member of the team passes the finishing line. **1.5.** The time allowed is based on the speed for the competition and the length of the course multiplied by the number of team members. **1.6.** If, during the round, disobediences with knock down are committed, the time corrections must be added to the time taken to complete the round (see JRs Art. 232). **1.7.** The elimination of a team member incurs the elimination of the whole team. **1.8.** The second disobedience by any team member or the first fall by an Athlete/horse eliminates the whole team. **1.9.** The team is eliminated if, in changing over, the Athlete takes off to jump an obstacle before the forefeet of the horse of his team member have reached the ground.
